As food justice leaders prepare for attacks on their work, they need spaces that allow them to show up as their whole selves. They need reserves of resilience to tap into through difficult times. We need to put **joy and connection** at the heart of our work to build new systems rooted in justice and liberation.

We must meet this food crisis together, and for that we need leadership from the nonprofit, philanthropic, government and industry sectors. The Seeding Power Fellowship is designed to reduce isolation, practice communication and collaboration, and deepen relationships. It provides not only leadership development, but **critical movement infrastructure** to build a responsive strategy and create a just food system.

WHAT IS THE SEEDING POWER FELLOWSHIP?

The **Seeding Power Fellowship** is a **nine-month cohort-based food justice fellowship program** for experienced leaders working across sectors to build equitable food systems. This program is designed for movement leaders and philanthropic partners in New York, New Jersey, and Connecticut.

Seeding Power is unique in both the region it serves and the focus on effective collaborations and equitable relationships, while including fellows from philanthropy and government. **Racial equity, social justice, active communication, and collaboration** form the core of a tested yet tailored curriculum designed by Emerging Equity.

By creating a community of practice that develops a shared analysis of the issues plaguing our food system, the **Seeding Power cohort will graduate with strengthened cross-sector relationships and skills** and the opportunity to develop projects together.

HOW IT WILL WORK

Seeding Power will achieve its goals and objectives by **developing skills** that: 1) create an effective community of practice; 2) form practices based on a foundational understanding of power and relationships; and 3) support successful and equitable team collaborations.

By **investing in leaders**, centering those most marginalized, and creating a shared analysis across the cohort, Seeding Power can grow the effectiveness and capacity of a unified food justice movement.

In addition to a core curriculum, fellows will be placed in **collaboration teams** and given ample time and coaching to **ideate and dream together** about how their work may align, and be strengthened by one another.

Philanthropic partners will be part of the cohort mix in acknowledgement of the influence funders exert in the food movement, and to allow for more **meaningful examination and dialog** for the potential of this influence.

The program is designed to **foster collaboration across sectors and regions** by providing opportunities to interact and align with each other's work, while also being grounded in healing, gratitude practices, and restorative justice so as to reduce burnout, assist with productive approaches to conflict, and promote movement sustainability.

Seeding Power will **provide a space to have challenging conversations** among organizations and sectors that are not always totally aligned, in order to find common ground and build consensus on a path forward.
